

The regular meeting of the Northport City Council convened at 6:00 p.m. on June 17th, 2019, at the Northport City Hall, located at 3500 McFarland Blvd. The invocation was offered by Councilman Hinton. President Logan led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call, the following were found to be present: President Logan, Councilman Roberts, Councilman Hinton, Councilman Davis, and Pro Tem Hogg. Also present was Mayor Aaron and City Administrator Bruce Higginbotham.

Motion by Councilman Roberts, **Second** by Councilman Hinton to **approve the agenda for June 17th, 2019**. Roll call vote was as follows: Councilman Roberts, Yes; Councilman Hinton, Yes; President Logan, Yes; Councilman Davis, Yes; and Pro Tem Hogg, Yes. **Motion Carried Unanimously.**

Motion by Councilman Hinton, **Second** by Councilman Davis to **adopt Permanent Resolution 19-67 Accepting Maintenance for Municipal Public Improvements in Turtle Bay Subdivision**. Roll call was as follows: Councilman Hinton, Yes; Councilman Davis, Yes; Councilman Roberts, Yes; President Logan, Yes; and Pro Tem Hogg, Yes. **Motion Carried Unanimously.**

Motion by Councilman Davis, **Second** by Pro Tem Hogg to **adopt Permanent Resolution 19-68 Accepting Maintenance for Municipal Public Improvements, except for final layer, constructed for property located at Glen Crest Phase II**. Public Comment:

Mr. Stephen Schwab, 2520 5th Street Northport, AL., addressed Mayor and Council stating that he used to occasionally use the pedestrian walkway in Northport but realized that it is not safe for pedestrians nor for bicyclists. This is what led Mr. Schwab to think about the construction of a separate bridge for pedestrians and bicyclists. He would like to discuss funding in a separate setting with Northport City Council as well as the head of West Alabama Chamber of Commerce, Tuscaloosa Mayor and the Tuscaloosa City Council. Mr. Schwab spent last week in Louisville, Kentucky. He walked a bridge that connects Louisville, Kentucky to Indiana. It is known as the Big Four Bridge. Mr. Schwab stated it is an abandoned railroad trestle that was converted into a pedestrian/bicycle walkway. It has been opened since 2013. Mr. Schwab provided Mayor and Council with several photos of the walkway. He was told the bridge is in constant use during daylight hours.

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President Logan advised Mr. Schwab that staff would take the photos and scan them and give originals back to Mr. Schwab at next meeting. Mr. Schwab stated he would be happy to answer any questions Mayor or Council had regarding this bridge and to feel free to call him on his cell phone, 205-614-2327.

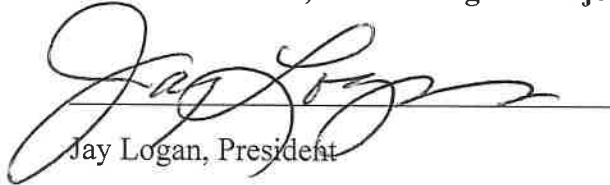
